DairyTas Seeks New Directors

Local dairy farmers and service providers are being urged to consider applying for two director positions on the Board of DairyTas that will become vacant at the organisation's Annual General Meeting in November.

DairyTas is the levy funded service provider in Tasmania working with Dairy Australia to deliver programs for the 430 dairy farmers in this state. DairyTas delivers around 20 projects and major activities over the year with a variety of funding sources involved.

Chairman, Simon Elphinstone says that: "We are looking for dairy farming and industry services people with a strong industry commitment and knowledge who are able to devote some time to working with a forward-looking organisation to promote the interests of dairying in Tasmania."

This is a chance to work with a progressive, development-oriented group of people who are coordinating a range of programs and activities around industry research, development, extension and education, supporting farmer needs and priorities across Tasmania. The roles are based around two three-year terms and include a director fee and travel allowance for prescribed activities.

The new director roles take effect from the November AGM of DairyTas and follow on from the retirement of Circular Head farmer Cherrylyn Ker and industry consultant Greg Bott.
